



Remembering Richard Marcroft Latta Blair March 7, 1945 - December 21, 2022

We regret to announce the death of Richard Blair on December 21, 2022.

Richard was born to David and Vivienne Blair in Glasgow, Scotland, joining his only sibling, Michael, on March 7, 1945. The family immigrated to Canada by ship in 1952. His first memory of Canada was the taste of fresh strawberries in Ottawa - a taste he never tired of. The family settled in Vancouver where Richard attended Magee High School, where he played rugby (his knees never forgave him), became a Queen Scout, took up skydiving (over 100 jumps!), and followed his big brother into the journalism field as a copy boy. This evolved into his first career as a journalist at the Vancouver Sun.

He entered UBC in 1963 where he spent the majority of his time at The Ubyssey newspaper, rising to the rank of City Editor by the time he met Fearon in August 1965. He had barely scraped through his final year of a BA, thanks to working too many hours at that paper, when he and Fearon tied the knot. But for some reason he was admitted to law school - on the day after their wedding.



In spite of continuing to work two nights a week as a journalist, he completed his law degree and articled with Clarke Wilson in Vancouver. The day after being admitted to the bar, they left to see the world, which they did in 19 months of travel, making many memories and friends along the way. They then settled in Kamloops, where Richard worked with Meikle Shupe Blair, then with Mair Jenson Blair, while managing to make time for hiking, skiing, cycling, canoeing, mountaineering, travelling, driving expensive, interesting and at times impractical vehicles, as well as some back room involvement in provincial and federal politics. He also served on the Overlander Extended Care Hospital board as member and chair, and was involved in the establishment of the Kamloops Foundation, now known as the BC Interior Community Foundation.

In 1989, he joined the BC Randonner Club, a long distance non-competitive cycling club which led him to cycle around 6000 km per year for many years, including a number of 1200 km rides through the Rockies. In 1985, he and Fearon did another year long grand tour around the world, focusing on South America for the first 6 months, then cycling thousands of km in Europe, and stopping in various other countries in Africa, Asia and the Pacific enroute home.

In 1992, he was appointed to the Supreme Court of BC, where he worked until retirement in 2013. He then became the first "judge in residence", a voluntary position, at the TRU law school for 3 years.

Richard succumbed to dementia and spent the last 3 years of his life in the care of the wonderful staff at the Kamloops Seniors Village. He leaves behind his wife Fearon, brother Michael and his family, cousins and their families in Scotland, his in-laws and their extended famililes across Canada, many long time friends which is a reflection of his many interests and pursuits, and Itsy, the last of a long line of dogs. He was a good man who loved his family, served his community, enjoyed his chosen work, and lived his life to the fullest. He will be missed by many.

A celebration of Richard's life will be held in the spring.

Remembering Michael Holtz

February 1, 2023

Mike passed away on February 1st, 2023 at the age of 69. He hailed from Calgary. As a young man, he worked for Spartan Air in Africa doing aerial surveys. He went into business development and owned a number of his own companies in Alberta before retiring and moving to Trail in 2019.

He came because he loved the area and quickly immersed himself in the community: Trail Rotary, Trail Historical Society, Trail Community in Bloom, Dinner Club and the West

Kootenay Smoke 'n Steel Car Club where he could often be seen cruising in his 1964 Morgan.

He is survived by his wife Ardith, children James (Sherri), Ken (Jasmine) and Sheena and five grandchildren, and sister Barb.

The family would welcome donations in Mike's memory to the Cancer Society.

Mike was well-loved and was an outstanding member of the community. He will be missed.

The 25th Hearts and Tarts Run - 2023 By Steve Blake

This year's Hearts and Tarts Run was a test for windshield wipers and RainX. The group met at the McDonald's in Tsawwassen in the pouring rain. We gathered in the restaurant with coffees and hot chocolate as we were introduced to new friends and shared stories with old. This run is a joint affair between the Pacific Morgan Owners Group and the Old English Car Club. We sort of let the anniversary slip past but this was the 25th running of the Hearts and Tarts.

Because of the rain and being early in the season, we only had four Morgans, an MGB GT, and a Jaguar XJS on the drive along with an eclectic mix of tin tops making up the balance of ten cars on the drive. Morgans were driven by Ken and Pat Miles (1960 Plus 4 DHC), Tom Morris and Elaine Davie (1973 Plus 8), Loy Leyland and Gin (1998 Plus 4, 4-seater) and Steve and Susan Blake (1991 Plus 8). Gerry and Anita Parkinson drove their 1969 MGC GT and Mike and Annie Roberts drove their Jaguar XJS Coupe. Total numbers were 21 plus a pooch!

Fortunately, as we left the parking lot to begin our run, the rain stopped! We had to put up with some spray from the road but it was quite manageable. The drive took us on a long loop of Ladner including going past the fish boat marina and along the historic Ferry Road. The end of this road is where the ferry took people to Richmond at the end of No. 5 Road in the days before the Deas Tunnel was built under the south arm of the Fraser River. We scooted through farmland and spotted many Bald-Headed Eagles as they perched on posts and trees in their winter habitat. The eagles, up to 2000 of them, hang around the Burns Bog dump and the recycling facility during the winter because it is warm and there is an abundance of food.

We continued south and did a loop of Tsawwassen. Notable sites along the way were the piles of sand with canvas bags left over from when we had king tides and high winds. Homeowners on the flat ground of Boundary Bay were in danger of flooding. We drove through the new Southlands housing complex with many townhomes, a marketplace and a new pub are being built. Our drive continued west up to English Bluff and back down to Tsawwassen Commons where Harry's Fish and Chip restaurant is located.

We were met by 5 members who did not do the drive but joined us for lunch. Harry's is run by a family who owned two fish and chip restaurants in the UK, one in Dover and one in Eastbourne. The special of the day was halibut and chips. Some had this while others tried the cod or a burger. Thumbs up all round for the food! It made a great finish to a pleasant 25th Anniversary Valentines Hearts and Tarts Run.

21 Gun Salute Concours d'Elegance By Steve Blake

Nigel Matthews was one of 35 international judges invited to be on the jury for the 10th edition of the prestigious 21 Gun Salute Concours d'Elegance held from January 6-8, 2023. The Concours was held at the Lukshmi Vilas Palace in Vadodara, India. For those of you who do not know Nigel Matthews, he was in charge of the collector car program at ICBC and now works for Hagerty Insurance. He has moved up within the company and is now the Global Brand Ambassador for Hagerty's. He is a very qualified concours judge and has judged at many prestigious events including Pebble Beach, Villa d'Este, Amelia Island, Salon Prive, and at Chateau Chantille.

According to Nigel, "We were guests of the Maharajah of Baroda in Vadodara. His palace is four times the size of Buckingham Palace and sits in 700 acres." Nigel said he was surprised to come across three Morgans at the event and has shared photos of these automobiles with us. The 21 Gun Salute Concours d'Elegance is touted to be the most prestigious concours in Asia.



It is interesting to see where the name 21 Gun Salute originated and its relevance to India. The Salute started with the naval tradition of firing off all the ship's cannons, while out of range or targets, when entering a foreign port. This would show the port that the ship had empty cannons so was not hostile. It progressed to being an honour for heads of state by firing off a 21 gun salute, or less for lower ranked dignitaries.

The British Raj afforded honours to the different princely states on the Indian sub-continent. A princely state was not directly governed by the British but by an Indian ruler under a form of indirect rule with an alliance to the British Crown. The Crown would grant a gun salute to the different princely states depending on their status or loyalty to the Crown. Starting with 3 guns, the honour would progress by twos to a top 21 Gun Salute. There were three princely states that earned



that honour. They were the Maharaja Gaekwad of Baroda State, the Maharaja of Mysore, and the Nizam of Hederabad. Samarjit Singh and Radhikaraje Gaekwad of the erstwhile royal family of Baroda are patrons of the event, which is supported by the Union Ministry of Tourism. It is organized by the 21 Gun Salute Cultural and Heritage Trust.



Along with these fine examples of Morgan motorcars, there were approximately 200 vintage and classic cars and 120 veteran motorcycles. These included automobiles that had belonged to the Maharaja of Baroda. Rajmata of Baroda Shubhanginiraje Gaekwad, during the opening ceremony, said she was delighted to see so many vintage cars converging at the palace and termed it a "precious heritage" of the country. "Even cars (from the Baroda family) which were lost from our vision for years, are back in our gardens," she said.

Automobiles included an 1886 Benz Patent Motorwagen, the first car invented by Mercedes-Benz founder Karl Benz, 1911 Napier, 1922 Daimler, 1930 Chevrolet depot hack, 1932 Chevrolet, 1935 Ford Special, 1938 Armstrong Siddeley, 1938 Rolls-Royce 25/30, 1947 Buick Roadmaster Convertible, 1947 Daimler DB18, 1948 Humber, 1948 Bentley Mark VI, 1948 BuickSuper, 1936 Dodge D2 Convertible Sedan, 1942 jeep ford GPW, 1936 Bentley 3.5, 1937 Bentley 4.24, 1937 Bentley Vanden Plas, a 1951 Dodge Station Wagon used by Field Marshal KM Cariappa, former Chief of Army Staff, a 1934 Nash Ambassador, and a 1947 Buick Super 8.

A special award was given to an 85 year old lady, Prabha Nene, who drove her 1934 Austin 7 to the event.

The show had a special section of MG cars. The MG cars on the display include 1946 MG TC, 1947 MG TC, 1948 MG TC, 1950 MG YT, 1951 MG TD, 1955 MG ZA Magnette Saloon, 1958 MG MGA, 1963 MG Midget, 1964 MG B, and a 1965 MGB. One of the MG TCs drove over 1500 miles to attend this Concours.

Restoring a Top By Steve Blake

The sun can play havoc with your soft top, especially the dark colours. If you have a canvas one, there is a great product that will bring life back to your sun-faded top. Renovo is a product made in the UK that is a dye for tops. Note - this is not for vinyl tops but for the canvas or cloth-type ones.

I purchased a jug of Renovo Soft Top Reviver from Moss Motors wondering if I had bought snake oil or something that would work. The top on my 1948 MG TC dates from 1978 and has spent time in the Okanagan sun. It was supposed to be black but it was far from that when I bought the car.

Renovo is made in the UK by Renovo International and made in five colours, black, dark green, dark red, dark blue, and dark brown. It sells for US\$50 through Moss Motors for a 1 litre bottle. They claim it is enough to do two coats on a convertible top. However, our tops are smaller than average so you can get more out of a jug. I used just under half a litre to cover my MG TC hood with two coats. I have enough left to do my tonneau cover and probably my side curtains.

First thing to do is clean your top so it is free of dirt, grease, or previous waterproof coatings. It won't absorb into the top if it has been waterproofed. After washing, let it dry before applying Renovo. I poured some into a measuring cup to see that I had about 250 ml. (No, I didn't use one of Susan's good ones from the kitchen!) I wasn't sure how far this product would go and using a quarter bottle for my first coat would be a good gauge of how far this product would



spread. As it turned out, I needed just under that amount for the first coat.

Use a 2 inch paint brush to apply in even strokes. I like to apply in straight lines from front to back. Make sure to cover all of the top so there are no missed spots. This is especially important toward the edges. You will get some drips and the brush does tend to spray a little depending how aggressive you are with it. I keep a damp cloth with me to wipe up any drips right away. If you let them dry, they are much tougher to get off. This is true for windows, chrome, and paint work.

Note: Work is being done on an MGTC but is the same for a Morgan.

I also place a tarp over the inside of the car so nothing could possible drip into the interior. If Renove drips onto your upholstery, you are going to have to live with it. Remember, Renovo is a dye and not meant to be able to be removed by washing it out otherwise you would have problems every time it rained!

Even after the first coat, the top looked great. I left the top to dry overnight because it was cold in my garage. I placed a light inside the car which warmed it up to about 65 degrees. The next morning, I applied the second coat and must say I am very pleased with the outcome. Make sure you give your car at least 24 hours to dry before you take it out in the rain. I did this and drove it in the rain the next day. There was no problems with drips, runs, or marks as the top was dry and set up for sufficient time to be cured.

Renovo Top Reviver works and saved me buying a new top. They suggest to complete the job, you apply Renovo Ultra Proofer but I did not have any. Maybe this additional product with make the Reviver last longer. I need to do further research but for now I am very happy. Highly recommended.




